We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Mason County Eastern Middle/High School. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2018-19. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2017-18. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2016-17. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as a STATE 'HAS NOT BEEN GIVEN AN IMPROVEMENT LABEL.

Mason County Eastern MS/HS has a high percentage of students and families that are economically disadvantaged. Our highest academic priority is to close the achievement gap. Our strategic focus is to mix high quality classroom instruction with high quality teacher-student relationships. This combination has worked to raise student engagement which has resulted in improved academic performance measured by NWEA MAP assessments.
